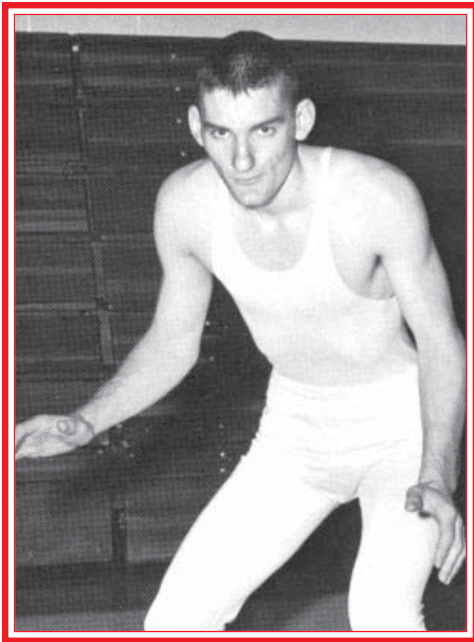

Class of 1967

Edward Foster participated in football and wrestling while at Northwest High School. He lettered three years in football and was named First team All Senate League and co-captained the team his senior year. Additionally, he earned three letters in wrestling and served as the captain of the 1967 team. He won the Northwest Invitational and was named “Outstanding Wrestler” of the tournament. His senior year, he won a Sectional Championship and placed third in the districts when only two qualified for state. He was awarded the “Quick Pin Award”, held the longest pin streak at nine, and was voted team MVP. In 1971, he placed second at the Southeast Ohio AAU tournament at heavyweight and third in the AAU State Tournament. He went on to graduate from Wittenberg University in 1971. At Wittenberg, he was a four year letterman. He co-captained the team his senior season and was selected MVP of the team. He was also a scholar athlete. He earned a master’s degree at Kent State University and served as a graduate assistant wrestling coach. Edward was the head wrestling coach at Big Walnut High School for ten years. He served as an assistant coach at Northwest and as a head coach at Indian River and Coventry High Schools. Ed and his wife, Beverly, have two daughters, Tami and Tanya. They also have 4 grandchildren.
